About The Rev. Elizabeth A. Eaton



ELCA presiding bishop.

The Rev. Elizabeth A. Eaton was reelected to serve a second six-year term as ELCA presiding bishop at the 2019 ELCA Churchwide Assembly. Eaton is the ELCA's fourth presiding bishop and was first elected at the 2013 ELCA Churchwide Assembly.

Eaton earned a Master of Divinity degree from Harvard Divinity School and a Bachelor of Music Education degree from the College of Wooster.

Eaton was ordained in 1981 and served three different congregations in Ohio before being elected bishop of the ELCA Northeastern Ohio Synod in 2006. She was reelected synod bishop in May 2013, shortly before her election as

Eaton's four emphases for the ELCA are: We are church; We are Lutheran; We are church together; We are church for the sake of the world. These four emphases are fundamental to identifying who the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America is.

In 2015, under Eaton's leadership, the ELCA underwent an extensive vision process to help this church journey faithfully and effectively together in the years ahead. The process resulted in Future Directions 2025, a strategic framework that helps shared leadership across the ELCA realize common aspirations and better face the challenges of this church.

In addition, with Eaton's guidance, the ELCA launched Bishop Eaton's Leadership Initiative, which encourages all ELCA members to seek out and inspire gifted people in our congregations and communities to consider a call to the ministry of the gospel.

As chief ecumenical officer of the ELCA, she represents this church in a wide range of ecumenical and interfaith settings. She is vice president for North America on the Council of the Lutheran World Federation and serves on the governing board and development committee of the National Council of the Churches of Christ in the USA and on the Religions for Peace USA Council of Presidents.

As presiding bishop, Eaton travels extensively, representing the ELCA in a variety of capacities. This has included a visit to a Syrian refugee camp; commemorating the 500th anniversary of the Reformation with Lutherans from around the world in Namibia; participating in an ecumenical service to commemorate the Reformation in the Lund, Sweden, cathedral with Pope Francis; visiting with migrants in Honduras; and attending the fifth consultation of women pastors and theologians in Tanzania.

Eaton's husband is the Rev. T. Conrad Selnick, an Episcopal priest. They are parents of two adult children, Rebeckah and Susannah.

Dear church,

Whatever personal perspective one might take on the June 24 abortion ruling from the Supreme Court, it is the legal framework in which we now minister, and I wish to speak a pastoral word at this time.

The Supreme Court has voted to overturn Roe v. Wade, removing federal constitutional protection for safe and legal abortion and leaving decisions about abortion law largely to the states. As a result, safe and legal abortion will likely not be accessible in every state. This church's 1991 social statement *Abortion* argues that "the number of induced abortions is a source of deep concern" but teaches that the practice should be legal (pp. 3, 9-10). In other words, "Laws should be enacted and enforced justly for the preservation and enhancement of life, and should avoid unduly encumbering or endangering the lives of women" (p. 9). Overturning Roe v. Wade and placing decisions about abortion regulation at the state level encumbers and endangers the lives of all persons who need to make decisions about unexpected pregnancies.

First, as a pastor of this church, I want to acknowledge that this decision affects many people, especially those whose pregnancies unfold in complex situations and the people who love them. Many now find their moral agency restricted because federal law no longer guarantees access to legal and safe abortion. They already face difficult moral questions, and the Supreme Court decision only adds to their anguish. As our social statement reminds us, we have both the freedom and the obligation to serve neighbors in complex situations. As a church, we are called at this moment to recognize and spiritually support people who are struggling with decisions around pregnancy.

Second, as presiding bishop, I want to remind this church that, despite this new legal landscape, we continue to depend on our social teaching for guidance. Our social statement provides the moral framework for our church's communal discernment and ministry, holding in tension both the strong Christian presumption to preserve and protect all life as well as the complex moral situations in which pregnancy sometimes occurs. Our social teaching is complex and does not hew to clear categories or labels such as "pro-abortion" or "anti-abortion."

That complexity is reflected in several points. The statement recognizes that pregnant persons have moral agency; they are the ones to make decisions about a pregnancy (see pp. 5-6). This church and its ministers trust them to decide but expect them to make such decisions in relationship—with God, self, partner, family, ministers and others.

Proposed changes to the Constitution of Faith Lutheran Church Blakeslee:

Congregational Council

Currently:

C12.02. The members of the Congregation Council except the Minister of Word and Sacrament, financial secretary, and treasurer shall be elected by written ballot at a legally called meeting of the congregation to serve *years or until their successors are elected. Such elected members shall be eligible to serve no more than two three-year terms consecutively.* Their terms shall begin at the Congregation Council meeting after the Congregation meeting at which they are elected.

Proposed:

C12.02. The members of the Congregation Council except the Minister of Word and Sacrament, financial secretary, and treasurer shall be elected by written ballot at a legally called meeting of the congregation to serve *for a term of two years, and can be elected to serve further consecutive terms without limit.* Such terms shall begin at the Congregation Council meeting after the Congregational meeting at which they are elected.

Rationale: The Congregation Council proposes this change to the Constitution of Faith Lutheran Church Blakeslee because of declining membership and the reluctance of enough members of the Congregation to adequately staff and serve on the Congregation Council.

Currently:

C12.03. Should a member's place on the Congregation Council be declared vacant, the Congregation Council shall elect, by majority vote, an interim successor until the next Congregational meeting. At the next Congregational meeting the congregation shall elect a member to complete the term of the vacant members place, whose term shall begin immediately after elected. *Members so elected to terms of 18 months or more shall be considered to have completed a full three-year term for purposes of determining eligibility for re-election as specified in the forgoing provisions of C12.02. Members elected to terms of less than 18 months shall not be considered to have completed a three-year term for purposes of determining eligibility for reelection as specified in the foregoing provisions of C12.02.*

Proposed:

Eliminate the portion of this section in bold italics

Rationale: The Congregation Council proposes this change in conjunction with changes to C12.02 as the portion of 12.03 to be eliminated becomes moot.

You, as members and friends of Faith Lutheran Church, have really lived up to this mission in so many ways. One of the most important is that you have elected a council who is active in continuing to fulfill the purpose of the mission throughout the year.

The Council in responsible for operating to protect and provide for our parishioners in sharing the love of Christ with everyone. PASTOR'S ANNUAL REPORT - 2022

I am now entering my second year as Faith Lutheran Church's part time interim Pastor. As a retired Pastor my contract with Faith and the Synod remains the same. I supply two worship services each month; I provide one day a week of office time at Faith; I attend the monthly council meeting; and I am available for guidance and pastoral support to members while I am at the church, and make home and hospital visits when appropriate.

The Covid pandemic has been challenging to all churches. As we've come out from its shadow, Faith Lutheran has had some unique obstacles to contend with this past year: lingering grief and consequences of Pastor North's unexpected death, the resignation of our office secretary, and a Pastoral candidate withdrawing early in the call process due to health reasons.

Yet despite all this, God's steadfast love and faithfulness continues to be known. With a combination of Pastors and lay leaders Sunday worship and special services on Christmas Eve and Holy Week continue to be held in our sanctuary. Religious educational opportunities have been offered for all ages with Sunday morning Bible Study, mid-week Advent and Lenten programs, mid-week "Sunday School", and Saturday Vacation Bible School. A variety of choirs have continued to praise God through Voice, Bells, Chimes and Boom whackers. Plus fellowship groups, committees, and outreach programs continue to provide social opportunities for the church and neighborhood.

Challenges will always be present in the life of faith. Opportunities present themselves too. A significant event this past year at Faith has been the "burning of the mortgage". This demonstrates the commitment of members and friends of Faith both past and present to the mission and ministry of this congregation. Faith's leadership, with consultation from Synod staff, has completed the necessary paperwork to interview candidates for the next called Pastor. Synod has posted this information on its website. May the Holy Spirit continue to respond to the needs of this community of faith.

Faith Lutheran Church Concert Committee 2022 Annual Report

This year the committee welcomed the enthusiastic participation of Don and Lois Childers and Molly Finkbiner who joined forces with Bob and Carol Ray to make the 2022 Summer Concert Series our best season ever! Thanks to our patient sponsors, congregation and community we were finally able to emerge from the pandemic and bring live entertainment back to the mountain.

The 2022 series featured The Amazing Magi, a delightful magic show in June performed by Pastor Michael Reist. July introduced the Irish American music of Poor Man's Gambit who fiddled their way right into our hearts. August sizzled with another rock-solid performance by Who Knows and a stop along the tour route by Mike Lewis, who grew up on our mountain and became a nationally recognized singer songwriter in Nashville. The season concluded in September with the uplifting performance of Pastor Stephen Perillo and The NEPA Praise Band.

We began 2022 with a balance of \$3,326. Our five performances cost \$2,000. Use of the church facility charge will be \$750. This leaves a balance of \$576. To date we have only received \$577 in our free will offering, but the season has three remaining shows at this writing.

The committee's efforts include serving the poor, hungry, lonely, oppressed, disadvantaged, imprisoned, homeless, sick and homebound.

Music Write-Up

This last year has been a time of transition in so many ways – including music. The choir returned to rehearsing just about one year ago. They shared music during services six times this year, which included a variety of styles – gospel, jazz, and choral arrangements of traditional hymns and tunes. The size of the group varies depending upon health, COVID risk factors and COVID wariness. The group took a hiatus over the winter when COVID cases skyrocketed, but has since returned to making music. The group is on break for the summer, but will begin to rehearse again this September.

Similarly, the church has returned to singing, albeit with a break where we returned to speaking the hymns during the winter. Beginning in the season of Epiphany, a new setting of service music (encompassing both some familiar and unfamiliar melodies) was introduced to the congregation, which they learned quickly and are singing beautifully.

While singing has taken some breaks this year, music has not. I've arranged sacred music for our children (and interested adults) to learn to play on boomwhackers, handbells, and tone chimes. Rehearsals occurred on Wednesday evenings during the months of the school year, and included learning to read music and watch the director, as well as musical games. Several times, songs were recorded via video and then shared with the congregation on Sunday mornings. Our tone chimes were refurbished in the spring, and our chimers shared their music-making via video for the Easter service. Singing, instrument play and musical games were also a part of our children's Vacation Bible Camp at the end of July.

Molly sits as part of the Music Planning Committee (also including Peg Rapp and Rick Halko), to choose hymns for Sunday services. The group meets six times per year and prayerfully chooses music based on the readings of the day and liturgical seasons. We also consider the familiarity of music, good times to introduce new songs, and feedback received about the music. Molly then meets with the Worship Committee via Zoom to report on musical happenings.

In addition to hymn planning, Molly takes care to plan Preludes, Offering Music, Communion Music (if needed), and Postludes according to liturgical season and the themes of each service. Offering music often includes either a choir piece, a solo, or musical collaboration. This year, congregation members Rick Halko, Judie Tim, Peggy Rapp, Dick Merrell, Phil Newlander, and our treasured visitor, Pastor Moore, have all contributed to special music collaborations by sharing their voices, unique musical styles, and instrumental talents with the congregation.

Molly has attended several webinars on Church and Copyright Law, and sends our music copyrights to the church secretary so that they can be included in the bulletin each week (particularly for purposes of live-streaming and recording). Molly reports all of our music used each week to our two licenses: CCLI and OneLicense.

Molly also attends Pocono Mission District Worship and Music meetings via Zoom when they are held (approximately three times each year). She shares helpful input from these meetings with the Worship Committee and/or Council, as applicable.

Technology Support Group

This group has not been formalized as a committee as we do not function in any kind of formal way. There are several members of the church that periodically use their knowledge and experience to advance the use of current technology at Faith.

The story of this group begins in 2020 before the pandemic started. Pastor North wanted to begin an online ministry by streaming our Sunday services using the internet. The council voted to use money from a memorial gift to upgrade our internet connection. Blue Ridge communication was contacted and an initial meeting was held and an estimate received. The pandemic intervened and slowed our progress in upgrading our connection to the outside world.

In the fall of 2020 Blue Ridge was re-engaged and they completed our internet upgrade to include switching away from Frontier Communications for the church's phone service. We now have an internet connection capable of supporting our live service streaming and our phone system with the bonus of costing much less than our older system.

In December of 2020 we began streaming live church services. Many of our members remained at home waiting for the COVID vaccine to be ready and could now "attend" services each week. This streaming also served to support the large number of members that head south for the winter. This part of the congregation now has a weekly window into Faith. This broadcast has evolved as Maritza, our former secretary, learned the best way to use our new equipment. Rick has also modified his audio feed to support the recording and streaming of the service each week. There is a legal component to using copyrighted material online, Molly Finkbiner has handled keeping us legal with respect to copyright laws.

Many people have had a hand in developing our current procedures and equipment. Maritza was thrust into a much more advanced technological environment beginning in March of 2020. She was supported by Pastor North, Molly Finkbiner, Rick Halko, Lauran Catrino, Ben Mroz and Paul Frantz.

With the departure of Maritza, Ben has picked up the effort to stream our services and make them available most Sundays. The audio portion continues to be refined by Rick Halko.

Ben Rick and Paul continue to function on an as needed basis to keep Faith's IT equipment functioning to support the ministry at Faith.
